How to prepare for darker and cooler seasons

One key aspect of furnace maintenance is checking and replacing the filter. A clogged or dirty filter can reduce the efficiency of your furnace, lead to higher energy bills, and even cause breakdowns that can be costly to repair. For seniors, checking a furnace filter may require assistance.
